Wednesday, Sept. 10, Field trip to Mountain Meadows Massacre. There will be no in-class lecture at UTU on this date. The first class is a field trip to the Mountain Meadows Massacre site on Wednesday, Sept. 10. Meet at 10 a.m. on the far east side of the Udvar Hazy building parking lot, where Loren will take attendance and give you the course syllabus, along with directions to the Dan Sill Hill site. Bring water and snacks. Carpooling is strongly recommended. The group will travel north on SR 18 about 32 miles to the MMM Dan Sill Hill site, where Loren will lecture for about 45 minutes at the monument, then the group will then leave the Dan Sill Hill parking lot and turn right (south) onto a gravel road and travel one mile in a southwesterly direction to a second monument site (the 1999 LDS Monument) at Magotsu Creek for a short 15-minute presentation. If time, we will also walk on a loop trail to a 2014 Siege monument or "Monument to the 10". Participants, on their own, are also welcome to travel one mile north of the 1990 monument to the 2011 Mens and Boys Monument and the 2014 Women, Children and Wounded Monument on SR 18.
