Course Description: This class will provide an overview of Utah's history including The Land; Utah's Earliest People; Explorers, Entrepreneurs, and Emigrants; Building a New Kingdom; Conflict and Culture, 1847-1857; Confrontation and Compromise, 1857-1869; Mining, Cooperation, and Challenge, 1870-1879; Change and Creativity in the Age of Woodruff, 1880-1896; Progressive Utah: Economics and Society, 1896-1917; Progressive Utah: Politics and Culture, 1896-1917; The Great War and the Little Depression, 1917-1930; Hard Times and a Tough People, 1930-1941; World War II and the Transformation of Utah, 1935-1945; An American Colony 1945-1969; An American Commonwealth, 1970-2003; Reflections on Utah's Kingdom, Colony and Commonwealth and looking to 2024 and beyond.
